# HOW ADVISORS ARE ENGAGED

Young adults and family members who have a diversity of lived experience are recruited, trained, matched, and supported throughout their placement within organizations and systems known as Placement Agencies.





# HOW PLACEMENT AGENCIES SECURE ADVISORS

Placement Agencies enter into an Agreement with the Engaging Families and Young Adults Program, and together, they design a framework for Advisor engagement. Placement Agencies must compensate Advisors for their time and expertise.

Meaningful engagement of people who have lived experience, within the design and execution of the initiatives intended to benefit them, creates opportunity for greater and more enduring impact.
